Reunion

Co-chair Role Description

With guidance from Annual Giving staff, the Reunion Gift Co-chairs recruit, motivate, and lead a committee of volunteers to build class participation and encourage leadership, loyalty, and upgraded reunion gifts. Along with the committee, Co-chairs conduct personal outreach to classmates from October through June 2025, and make the case for giving to MIT, particularly for unrestricted and scholarship support.

Primary Responsibilities

- 1. Make a personal gift to your Reunion Gift Campaign by the fiscal year-end (6/30)
- 2. Recruit a group of classmates representing a diverse array of the class (15-25 members)
- 3. Work with Annual Giving staff to establish class dollar and participation goals
- 4. Attend the Alumni Leadership Conference and appropriate MIT Volunteer Training Academy sessions as your schedule permits
- 5. Participate in virtual committee meetings and trainings, and help to develop meeting content, share updates, and co-lead committee calls alongside MIT Annual Giving staff
- 6. Participate in classmate screenings to garner classmate giving potential and identify top prospects
- 7. Select, solicit, and encourage pledges from 20-25 classmates through MIT's Outreach Management Tool (OMT)
- 8. Focus outreach around key MIT giving dates, including Giving Tuesday (late Nov./early Dec.), the MIT 24-Hour Challenge (mid-March) and Reunion lead-up (May-June)
- 9. Ensure 100 percent gift participation from the committee by Tech Reunions; solicit committee members as deemed appropriate
- 10. Participate in Outreach Hours as your schedule allows
- 11. Thank classmates upon receipt of their gift
- 12. Respect the confidentiality of personal information provided by Annual Giving staff

Time Commitment

Term is approximately 1 year, through the end of MIT's Fiscal Year (6/30). Ability to meet monthly time commitment of 3-4 hours per month.

Training and Support

Alumni Leadership Conference (ALC) Academy training sessions, committee kickoff call training, MIT Volunteer Knowledge Base, 1:1 training with Annual Giving staff as needed.
