TRAVEL WITH ANDREW BABBIN Cecil & Ida Green Career Development Associate Professor of Chemical Oceanography and Marine Microbiology at MIT





Professor Andrew Babbin is a field-going oceanographer, biogeochemist, and climate scientist. He joined the MIT faculty in 2017 in the Department of Earth, Atmospheric and Planetary Sciences. His research exploring how microorganisms shape global climate has taken him across the world, sampling lakes in Antarctica, coral reefs in Cuba, anoxic waters in the Pacific, and air in the Galápagos. He is the recipient of numerous accolades, including an NSF CAREER award and a recent MIT Bose research grant to study shark migrations as a tracer of ocean chemistry. On this trip through Alaskan waters,

Professor Babbin looks forward to spotting marine life and sharing information on the complexities of ecosystems and global climate dynamics.

Close Encounters With Incredible Creatures

National Geographic Quest's experienced captain and expedition staff know where to find iconic wildlife. Their connections to local experts, such as members of the Alaska Whale Foundation, mean we have insider tracking of whale whereabouts–creating amazing observation and photo ops. Schedules permitting, researchers from the Alaska Whale Foundation come aboard to share their knowledge and latest findings, and to provide insight into humpback behavior. The naturalists may even drop a hydrophone to reveal whale communication. You can also observe the wild ocean below, as the undersea specialist dives to shoot video of the otherworldly creatures or deploys the remotely operated vehicle (ROV), which feeds footage to TV screens in the ship lounge.

Your Basecamp for Adventure

The 50-cabin *National Geographic Quest* was purpose-built to explore the wildest corners of Southeast Alaska. A nimble design allows you to sail into spectacular winding fjords and shallow, fast-moving channels where whales feed. Share the thrill of spotting diving humpbacks and



foraging bears from the expansive bow–and use onboard tools like ROVs and spotting scopes for deeper exploration.

Every day brings new adventure and an array of active options. Start your morning with a stretch on the sundeck with the wellness instructor, then hike or walk through the towering forest, with time for your naturalists to share the unique wonders of the native flora. Observe a calving glacier by Zodiac; try your hand at stand-up paddleboarding; visit a typical Alaskan town; or kayak along wildlife-rich shorelines, keeping watch for swooping bald eagles and gregarious sea lions. Each day, there will be a range of activities that allow you to explore your interests at your own pace.

Voyage Itinerary

Experience the remarkable beauty of Southeast Alaska on a voyage aboard the 50-cabin *National Geographic Quest*, sailing into a land of mist-shrouded fjords, tidewater glaciers, and islands teeming with wildlife. Kayak amid glacial ice, spend a full day exploring Glacier Bay National Park, learn about Alaska's rich Tlingit heritage, and more.

DAY 1 • Sitka, Alaska/Embark

Arrive in Sitka, Alaska, situated on the western coast of Baranof Island and overlooking the Pacific Ocean. Schedules permitting, walk among Tlingit and Haida totem poles at Sitka National Historic Park and visit the Alaska Raptor Center for an up-close look at Alaska's birds of prey. Embark this evening in time for cocktails and an introduction to the staff and crew. Please note: Itinerary stops and sequence subject to modification. (D)



DAY 2 • Southeast Alaska's Islands, Bays & Fjords

Our Forest Service Special Use Permit for Tongass National Forest enables guests to hike and kayak in wild and remote areas of Southeast Alaska. Today, nature is our guide as we set forth with the flexibility to take advantage of wildlife and weather conditions. We may stop at an isolated beach to take a closer look at tide pools, beachcomb, and hike stunning forest trails. Keep an eye out for old bear tracks worn into the soil as you move from forest to meadow. Sightings of bald eagles are common. If conditions permit, we will do some kayaking, always watching for marine and terrestrial life. (B,L,D)

DAY 3 • Icy Strait and the Inian Islands

Explore among the Inian Islands, a busy feeding ground for myriad wildlife species including Steller sea lions and sea otters. We will search for marine mammals in the nutrient-rich waters of Icy Strait and choose the perfect spot around Chichagof Island to hike where sightings of bald eagles are common. (B,L,D)

DAY 4 • Glacier Bay National Park

We spend the entire day amid the coves, fjords, tidewater glaciers and majestic mountains of Glacier Bay National Park. Witness glaciers that end abruptly at the water's edge and observe them calving, when tons of ice separate and crash into the water accompanied by a thunderous sound. Mountain goats scaling the peaks as well as harbor seals, Steller sea lions and puffins are some of the creatures we may observe. A visit to Tidal Inlet may bring the sight of brown bears lumbering up the hillside. (B,L,D)

DAY 5 • Frederick Sound and Chatham Strait

These waters are prime areas for both orca and humpback whales. With luck, guests may observe their fascinating behavior–breaching, tail-slapping and variations on feeding–as we fill the deck and listen to the play-by-play from our

expert naturalists. We will explore spectacular bays and inlets, following bear trails and salmon streams. Once ashore, we have the opportunity to walk along a quiet forest trail. The still waters are excellent for kayaking, offering another option for up-close exploration. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 • Petersburg

Visit the small, true Alaska fishing town of Petersburg on Mitkof Island, which still retains much of its Norwegian heritage. Explore a unique Southeast Alaska ecosystem, the muskeg, with stunted trees and carnivorous plants. There is an opportunity to stretch your legs with an optional bike ride around town. This evening, enjoy a crab feast. (B,L,D)

DAY 7 • Tracy Arm-Fords Terror Wilderness

Voyage into Tracy or Endicott Arm, both spectacular fjords, with waterfalls cascading from glacially carved walls. See the soaring Dawes or South Sawyer Glacier up close and take a cruise in a Zodiac for an unbeatable view among sculpted icebergs. Keep an eye out for harbor seals, harbor porpoises and arctic terns. (B,L,D)

DAY 8 • Juneau, Alaska/Disembark

After breakfast we disembark in Juneau. Take time to visit the local shops before exploring the newly constructed Alaska State Museum, with its sprawling collection of natural history and cultural artifacts. Transfer to the airport for connecting flights home. (B)

Purpose-built to explore North American coastlines, *National Geographic Quest* has decks designed for exceptional wildlife viewing and shallow drafts for navigating the innermost reaches of carved coastlines. She is U.S.-flagged, eliminating domestic customs stops and allowing more time to explore.


Wellness
